Eruch Slaps a Tresspasser

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ERUCH: You know what happened one day. This reminds me of an episode which Meher Baba told us. I don't know. You may not have read anything about Meher Baba.

PILGRIM 1: I have read a couple of books.

ERUCH: Yeah.

PILGRIM 1: I have.

ERUCH: No, but I don't know whether you have read, called "Highest of the High." A message that He had given in Dehradun at the time.

PILGRIM 1: No. That I haven't.

ERUCH: Yeah. In which He says that, "Take me not to be a saint or a mahatma or a yogi or a wali or anything of that sort." He said, "Take me to be an ordinary human being, or take me to be what I am. And that is, I am the Avatar of the age. In between, don't take me anything because I am either ordinary man," Because then Baba says, "That when I take the avatarhood I descend as man, become man. ERUCH: Yeah. And only they used to stay down the Hill. So He used to stay up there and nobody was permitted. Boards were put, "Prohibited Area", "No Thoroughfare", and all sorts of things. So one day while He is now about to leave lower Meherabad. We call it Lower Meherabad. Where you are staying is called Lower Meherabad. That is known as Upper Meherabad, you see.

So while He is leaving in the evening, going up towards Upper Meherabad. There is a place called the dhuni spot that is there. There is a platform there even now by the side of the road. So He stopped over there and same Padri Kaka. And there is one called Pendu Kaka. He is here, the other old man. These are the two tottering pillars, still alive, you see. So they both were there.

This Pendu Kaka was the manager and Padri Kaka, who is now the manager, was the engineer in charge of the colony where there were 500 people staying once. So both were there. And Baba, you know, was observing silence. So He used to use that type of board. See that board there. So last moment some instructions were. They had asked Him questions so there were questions and answers were there. So He was dictating on the board. And I was there. I had to escort Him up the Hill. And at the time when He would want to come down I had to bring Him down. So I was about to go with Him. So I am with Him and the two are there. And He is telling them something and all that. And all of a sudden, He became very stern. He says, "Who is that person going up the hill? That man?"

So He looked at me. He says, "Go, run there and stop him from entering there. He should not go there. Does he not know that he should not go there? Get him down. Give him a tight slap and drag him down here. Tell him not to go there. You should know that nobody should go there."

He says, "I have come for Meher Baba's darshan."

I said, "This is not the place for you. Come on get down."

I caught hold of his hand. Dragged him down. He was stunned. He didn't know what to do. "I have come for His darshan. What's the matter? What is going on over here?"

So I dragged him down. And I was so happy that I could obey Meher Baba's orders. Master's orders. Obedience is something great, you see. And I was very happy. And proudly I presented this culprit, you see, before Baba. And Baba, all love and compassion. He looks at him with a smile and He says, "How blessed you are that you came for my darshan and you got a tight slap. You were humiliated. What a blessing to be humiliated when you want to come for my darshan."
